



My long term goal is to be become a CEO of any MNC company.

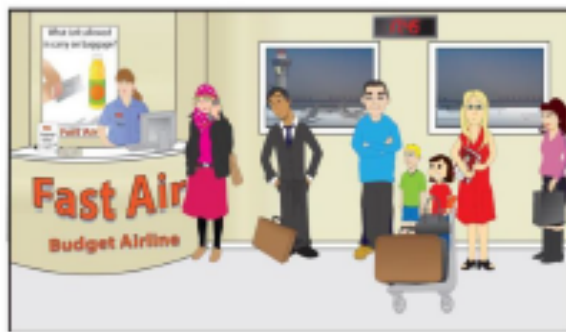
Role Play

4. Mr. Sk. Sadik -Arithmetic & Reasoning.

To ensure personalized attention and maximize the effectiveness of the learning outcomes, the students were divided into four separate batches.

Topics Covered in the Training Program:

1. **Quantitative Aptitude:** The program commenced with an extensive exploration of quantitative aptitude, a pivotal component of software company written tests. Students received comprehensive guidance on mathematical concepts and problem-solving techniques relevant to these assessments. Ms. P. Sowjanya and Mr. Sk. Sadik provided thorough training in aptitude topics.
2. **Logical Reasoning:** Students acquired the skills to analyze complex problems and make logical deductions, a critical aspect of many software company tests. Ms. P. Sowjanya offered in-depth training in reasoning topics.






