



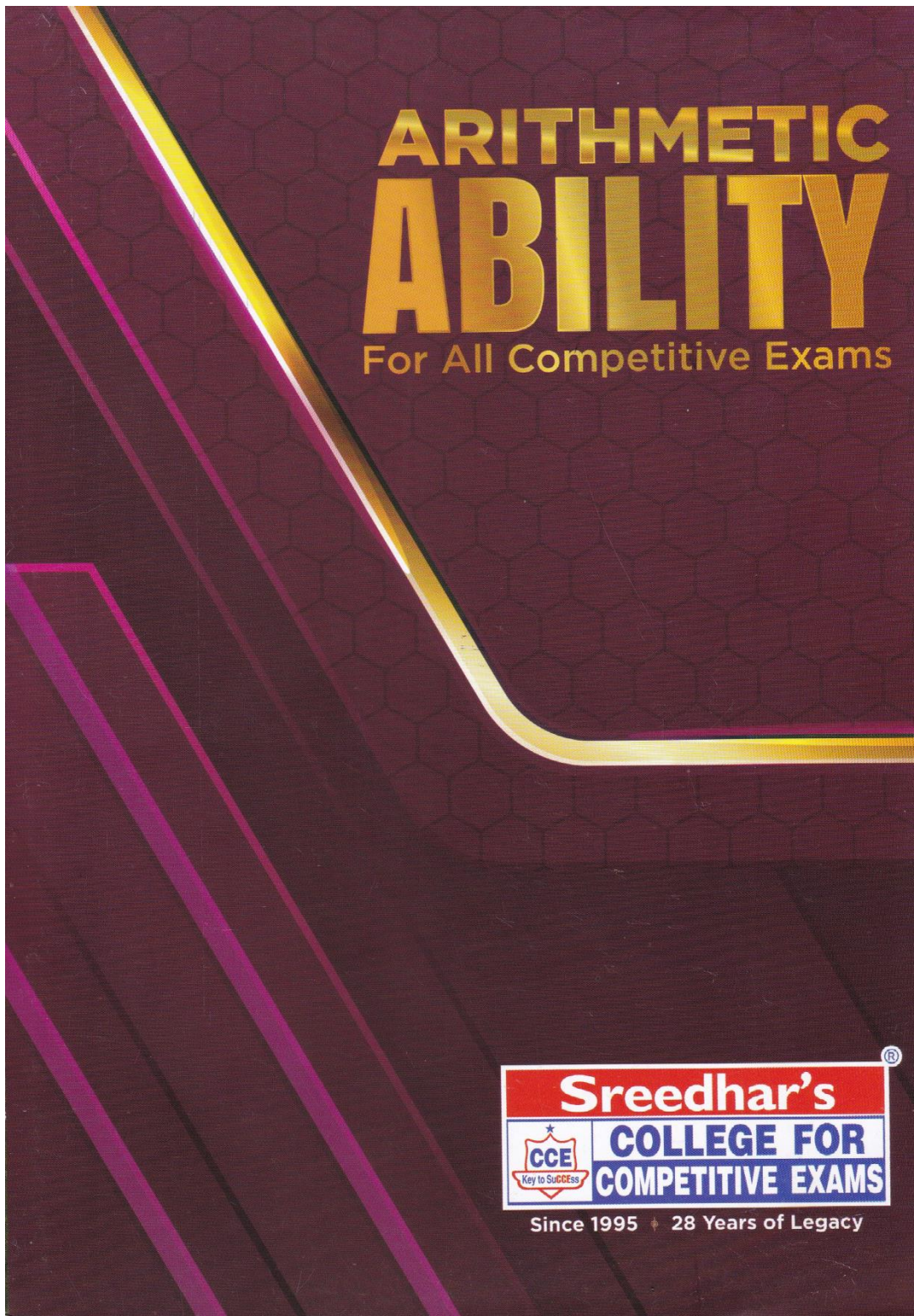

NUMBER SYSTEM



1. (a) **Natural Numbers** : The counting numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, are called the natural numbers and their set is denoted by N.

$$N = \{1, 2, 3, 4, \dots\}$$

- (b) **Whole numbers** : The set of whole numbers is denoted by W.

$$W = \{0, 1, 2, 3, 4, \dots\}$$

- (c) **Integers** : All the natural numbers, zero and the negatives of natural numbers are called integers.

$$I = \{\dots, -3, -2, -1, 0, 1, 2, 3, \dots\}$$

- d) **Rational Numbers** : The numbers which can be expressed in the form $\frac{p}{q}$, where p and q are integers and $q \neq 0$ are called rational numbers and their set is denoted by Q.

e.g., $\frac{1}{2}, \frac{3}{4}, -\frac{1}{8}$, etc. are rational numbers.

- e) **Irrational Numbers** : The numbers which when expressed in decimal form are neither terminating nor repeating decimals are called irrational numbers.

e.g., $\sqrt{2}, \sqrt{3}, \pi, e$, etc. are irrational numbers.

- f) **Real Numbers** : All rational and irrational numbers together form the set of real numbers, denoted by R.

2. **Even and Odd Numbers** : The counting numbers divisible by 2 are called even numbers and not divisible by 2 are called odd numbers.

3. **Prime Numbers and Composite Numbers** : Prime numbers are the numbers greater than one which are either divisible by 1 or by itself. Eg. 2, 3, 5, 7, 11, 13, ...

Composite numbers are numbers greater than one which have atleast one factor, other than 1 or itself.

Eg. 4, 6, 9, 10, etc.

Note : 1 is neither prime nor composite.

4. **Tests of Divisibility** :

Divisible by 2 : A number is divisible by 2, if its unit digit 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8.

Divisible by 3 : A number is divisible by 3, if the sum of the digits of the number is divisible by 3.

Divisible by 4 : A number is divisible by 4, if the number formed by the last two digits is divisible by 4.

Divisible by 5 : A number is divisible by 5, if its unit's digit is either 5 or 0.

Divisible by 6 : A number is divisible by 6, if it is divisible by 2 and 3 simultaneously.

Divisible by 7 : If the last digit (unit's digit) of a number is multiplied by 2 and this product is subtracted from the number formed by remaining digits and the remainder so obtained is 7 or 0 (this operation may be repeated if necessary) then the number is divisible by 7.

Divisible by 8 : A number is divisible by 8, if the number formed by the last three digits is divisible by 8.

Divisible by 9 : A number is divisible by 9, if the sum of the digits of the number is divisible by 9.

Divisible by 10 : A number is divisible by 10, if its unit's digit is 0.

Divisible by 11 : A number is divisible by 11, if the difference of the sum of its digits on odd places and the sum of the digits in even places is either 0 or divisible by 11.

Divisible by 12 : A number divisible by 6, if it is divisible by 3 and 4 simultaneously.

Divisible by 13 : If the last digit (unit's digit) of a number is multiplied by 4 and this product is added to the number formed by remaining digits and the number so obtained is divisible by 13 (this operation may be repeated if necessary) then the number is divisible by 13.

Divisible by 14 : A number is divisible by 14, if it is divisible by 2 and 7 simultaneously.

Divisible by 15 : A number is divisible by 15, if it is divisible by 3 and 5 simultaneously.

Divisible by 16 : A number is divisible by 16, if it is divisible by 2 and 8 simultaneously.

Divisible by 17 : If the last-digit (unit's digit) of a number is multiplied by 5 and this product is subtracted from the number formed by the remaining digits of that number and the remainder so obtained is divisible by 17 (this operation may be repeated if necessary), then the number is divisible 17.

5. Specific Rules :

- i) If all three digits of a three digits number are same, the number is divisible by 3 and 37.
- ii) If all the size digits of a 6 digit number are same, the number is divisible by 3, 7, 11, 13 and 37.

6. Division Algorithm :

Dividend = (Divisor \times Quotient) + Remainder

7. Co-prime Numbers : Two numbers are co-prime, if their G.C.D. is 1. For example, (2, 3), (3, 23), (5, 7), etc. are co-prime numbers.

8. Multiple : Multiple of a number = the number \times a counting number.

Every number is a multiple of itself and 1.

Factor : When two or more numbers are multiplied, we get a product. Each of the numbers is called a factor of the product.

1 is a factor of every number and a number is a factor of itself.

9. Fundamental Arithmetical Operations : The four fundamental (basic) operations of arithmetic are - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We use the sign '+' for addition, '-' for subtraction, ' \times ' for multiplication and ' \div ' for division.

10. Computation of Whole Numbers : Here we consider the problems based on four fundamental operations (Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division) in case of whole numbers {0, 1, 2, 3, 4,}

These operations on integers, fractions (simple and decimal) comes in the sequel. The other operations like power and root (underroot, etc.) will follow in the next headings.

EXAMPLES

1. Check the divisibility or 13580259 by 11.

Solution :

Sum of the digits at odd places

$$= 9 + 2 + 8 + 3 = 22$$

Sum of the digits at even places

$$= 5 + 0 + 5 + 1 = 11$$

Difference of sums = $22 - 11 = 11$, which is divisible by 11. So, 13580259 is divisible by 11.

2. Without actual division, show that :

(a) 42464 is divisible by 8.

(b) 24165 is divisible by 15.

Solution :

(a) The number formed by the last three digits of given number is 464 which is divisible by 8. \therefore Given number 42464 is divisible by 8.

(b) The prime factors of 15 are 3 and 5.

(i) Sum of the digits of given number is $2 + 4 + 1 + 6 + 5 = 18$, which is divisible by 3. So, the number is divisible by 3.

(ii) Since, there is 5 at the unit place of the number, so the number is divisible by 5.

Hence, the given number is divisible by 15.

Note : If a and b are two co-prime numbers and a number is divisible by a and b exactly, then the number will be divisible by ab.

3. If $34 \square 68$ is to be divisible by 9, then the value of missing digit \square should be :

Solution :

The number will be divisible by 9 when the sum of its digits is divisible by 9.

$$\text{Here, } 3 + 4 + \square + 6 + 8 = \square + 21$$

\therefore If we replace 6 with \square , the sum becomes 27 which is divisible by 9.

Hence, the option (A) is correct.

4. On dividing 317029 by a certain number, the quotient and the remainder are 559 and 76 respectively. Find the divisor.

Solution :

We have,

$$\text{Divisor} = \frac{\text{Dividend} - \text{Remainder}}{\text{Quotient}}$$

$$= \frac{317029 - 76}{559} = 567$$

5. Find the greatest 5-digit number which is exactly divisible by 330.

Solution :

The greatest 5-digit number is 99999. Dividing 99999 by 330, the remainder is 9.

So, the required greatest number is $99999 - 9 = 99990$.

6. Find the smallest 6-digit number which is exactly divisible by 23.

Solution :

The smallest 6-digit number is 100000. Dividing 100000 by 23, the remainder is 19.

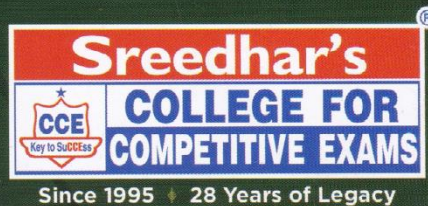
So, the required smallest number is $100000 + (23 - 19) = 100004$.

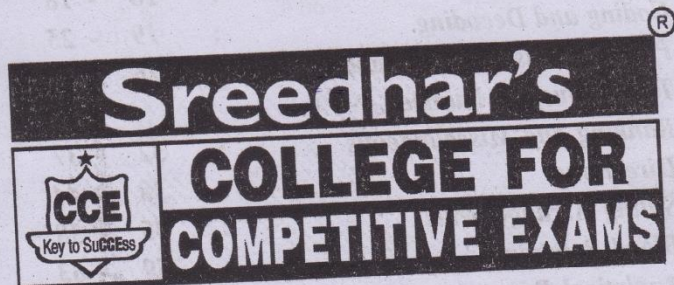

ANALOGIES

Introduction : 'ANALOGY' means 'SIMILARITY', having similar features, or 'ANALOGY' means 'CORRESPONDENCE'.

This test of reasoning tests the ability of a candidate to understand the relationship between two given objects and apply the same relationship to find that is asked in the question. The intellectual skill of the candidate is important to analyse the similarity between two or more objects. This test is meant to test a candidate's overall knowledge, power of reasoning and ability to think concisely and accurately. The relationship can be established in a number of ways.

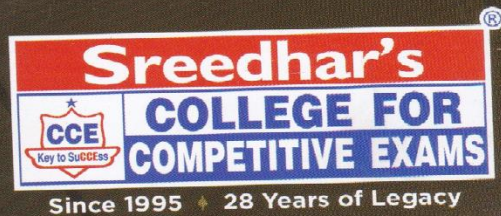

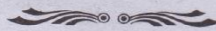

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1 - READING COMPREHENSION

PASSAGE-1

Directions (1-5) : Read the following passage and answer the questions as directed.

The basic idea of the Aadhaar Payment Bridge System (APBS), an offspring of the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), is that a person's Aadhaar number becomes her financial address. **(I)** provide multiple account details (say, her name, bank account number and IFSC code) to receive a bank transfer, she only has to provide her Aadhaar number.

Induction of a bank account into APBS involves two distinct steps, both of **(II)** be based on informed consent. First, the account must be "seeded" with the customer's Aadhaar number. Second, it must be connected to the NPCI mapper — a step known as "mapping". In cases of multiple accounts for the same person, the APBS automatically sends money to the latest-mapped account.

To understand the dangers of this "bridge", we must rewind to 2014, when the Jan Dhan Yojana (JDY) was launched. In the **frantic** drive that followed, millions of bank accounts were opened and seeded with Aadhaar in a haphazard manner, under relentless pressure from the Central government. Some JDY accounts certainly served a purpose, but many others were superfluous and created a confusing multiplicity of accounts. More importantly for our purpose, Aadhaar numbers were seeded into these accounts without proper verification.

Haphazard seeding continued well beyond 2014 because the government wanted to bring all direct benefit transfer (DBT) payments — pensions, scholarships, subsidies, MGNREGA wages, and so on — under the Aadhaar payments umbrella. Government departments started sending bulk lists of bank accounts and Aadhaar numbers to the banks for Aadhaar seeding. Meeting the seeding targets was the top priority and due verification, once again, **(III)**.

Thus, the groundwork required for APBS to work — reliable seeding of bank accounts with Aadhaar — had simply not been done when the APBS was rolled out. The seeding mess, it seems, was sought to be cleaned up by making "e-KYC" compulsory. This essentially means that account holders were required to go through biometric authentication to verify their Aadhaar number and identity information. To enforce e-KYC, many banks used the "ultimatum method": a deadline was set, and people's accounts were blocked when they missed the deadline.

Compulsory e-KYC became a nightmare for poor people, for a number of reasons: some did not know what they were supposed to do, others had problems of biometric authentication, others still struggled with inconsistencies between the Aadhaar database and the bank database. Among the worst victims were old-age pensioners. To this day, in Jharkhand, many pensioners are struggling to understand why their pension was discontinued after e-KYC was made compulsory.

PASSAGE-2

Increased warming in the Indian Ocean and the resultant weakening of the Indian summer monsoon may come in the way of India's goal of leading the world's wind power generation. Analysing the available wind and atmospheric data from 1980-2016, researchers from Harvard University, U.S., and National Climate Center in Beijing, China, found the potential electricity production of windmills across India had decreased by about 13%. And this trend might continue. However, researchers in India have raised doubts about the results of the study. "The data used by the team does not **correlate** with the live data we have. We have started additional studies to validate these results and will publish the findings soon," says Dr. K. Balaraman, Director General, National Institute of Wind Energy, Chennai, under the Government's Ministry of New and Renewable Energy. In the paper published last December in Science Advances, the researchers showed a decline in electricity production in the States of Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Gujarat, and Karnataka. **(A) Not significant decline was seen in Tamil Nadu, which is located on the east coast and, thus, had different wind conditions during summer.**

"The government could concentrate on setting up more projects in this region [Tamil Nadu] as the lifetime of wind turbines is 20 to 30 years. We need to look at long-term goals," says Meng Gao, a postdoctoral fellow at the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences, Harvard University and the first author of the study. The researchers showed that 63% of the annual production of electricity from wind is **(B) -----** by winds in spring (March-May) and summer (June-August). Interestingly, they found a decrease in wind power during these months. This could be due to the weakening of the Indian summer monsoon during this period.

Summer winds in India are driven by the temperature contrast between the Indian subcontinent and the Indian Ocean, and the warming in the Indian Ocean reduced this contrast. Also, warming of the Equatorial Indian Ocean resulted in a decline in the wind speed. The Indian government has set a target of 60 GW of **cumulative** wind power capacity by 2022. The researchers say that this goal can

be (C)----- only if planners in India take these historical reconstructions into account while setting up wind power installations in the future. "Our findings can provide suggestions on where to build more wind turbines to minimise the influences of climate change," said Prof. Michael B. McElroy, from the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences, Harvard University and senior author of the study in a release.

PASSAGE-3

The West Bengal Government's decision to open English sections in as many as 100 government and government aided Bengali-medium schools has caused euphoria among students, teachers and guardians. The policy English medium facilities from the primary to higher secondary levels. The objective is to stop the mass exodus of students to private English medium schools. Some express doubt about the efficacy of the policy; others are hopeful about the outcome of the action. Two changes will come from the introduction of English sections. First, English will replace Bengali as a medium of instructions. Second, teachers will find themselves in an ideal classroom situation (I).

But they are not enough to win the confidence of guardians. Both English

and Bengali sections will read or use books with the same content for all subjects. The difference lies only in the language or medium of instruction. Translations are not up to the mark. Both the subject and the language must be grasped **(II)**. **Another impediment is a woeful dearth of teachers who are qualified to teach in English.** Most teachers with Bengali medium background get scared at the idea of imparting instructions in English. Once they fathom the weight of the new responsibility, they will find teaching in English-medium sections a challenge. A few, too few, have the confidence to rise to the occasion.

Such being the case, the new sections will be in shambles. It is imperative for the government to open pure English-medium schools, rather than split the medium of instruction in each of the 100 schools. They should be raised to the status of model schools.

What will happen to the majority of schools that will not have English sections? It is a matter of **(III)**. A complete overhaul of the school education system is required. Teaching is the only profession without any provision for probation. In other professions, be it a government job or a corporate job, a probationary period is part of the service. But many **embark** on a teaching career at school level without the right mindset. Sensitising new recruits to the core aspects of teaching can give them a good start.




